# THE LEARNING CONTINUES OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM

**Reception** visited Stowell Street in Newcastle, where they enjoyed studying the Chinese gate and visiting the supermarket to buy some food and decorations for a celebration back in school. The children also enjoyed sharing fortune cookies and reading the messages inside. The Reception children also went to the nearby Discovery Museum, where they took part in a variety of exciting challenges in the Science Maze.

Year 1 visited 'Locomotion' at the National Railway Museum in Shildon. They enjoyed investigating locomotives ranging from the 1829 Sans Pareil to the 1970's Advanced Passenger. The children climbed into some of the locomotives and imagined what it might have been like to be the driver of a steam train.

Year 2 visited Sainsbury's in Sunderland where they were able to apply their understanding of money in a real-life context. The children enjoyed working on various maths problems in the supermarket and navigating their way around the aisles. The children then visited Seaham Harbour where they viewed the two sculptures by Ray Lonsdale before taking inspiration by creating their own sculptures back in the classroom

Year 3 visited The Great North Museum in Newcastle linking to their Science unit of study on Rocks where the children were able to handle, examine and classify a range of different rock types, including solidified volcanic lava. On return to school, the children of Year 3 went on to discuss the properties of different rock types and produced an information leaflet on how and why each rock type is used in everyday life.

Year 4 visited the recently refurbished Spanish Gallery in Bishop Auckland in relation to their art theme of 3D and sculpture. The children were given a tour of the state-of-the-art facilities by an expert guide during which they were able to examine a range of original art work by Francisco de Zurbarán and other famous artists. The children then created their own clay sculptures, taking inspiration from the artwork examined.

Year 5 visited Bishop Auckland linking to their historical unit of study of Tudor England. The children learned about the history of the area, with focus on the links to the Tudor period including Bishop Auckland Castle. The children then took part in a workshop in which they designed and made a glass Tudor Rose. Back at school, Year 5 continued their Tudor learning by studying different aspects of life in England at this time including crime and punishment, architecture and the impact of King Henry VIII's reign on the country.

Year 6 visited the fascinating Victoria Tunnel in the Ouseburn area of Newcastle. Although the tunnel was originally built to transport coal during the Victorian period, it was also used as an air-raid shelter during World War II. The children were given a guided tour of the tunnel, learning all about its amazing history before taking part in a workshop which was led by Marion, who lived through WWII as a child. On return to school, the children wrote a letter from the point of view of an evacuee child as well as report on how the tunnel was used during WWII.
